There will also be tryouts for the Youth Olympic Game spots where one female and one male from the recurve discipline will travel to Singapore to compete on behalf of the USA at the first annual Youth Olympic Games.

Youth Olympic Games Trials

Standings: Archers will compete in the 144 Arrow Qualification Round, the Team Round, the Mix Team round, and the Olympic (OR) round (using the FITA Set System). The JOAD National Grand Champion is based on final placement in the Qualification Ranking Round, participation in the Team Round and the final placement of the Olympic (OR) Round. All ties will be broken via FITA rules. Jr. USAT points are based on current USA Archery rules.

Awards: Gold, Silver and Bronze medals will be awarded in the Qualification Ranking Round, the Team Event, the Mixed Team Event and the Olympic Round (OR) in Junior, Cadet, Cub and Bowmen for Recurve and Compound, Male and Female.

A JOAD National Grand Champion award will be awarded in Junior, Cadet, Cub and Bowmen for Recurve and Compound, Male and Female.

Eligibility: JOAD National Championship competitors must be a member of a JOAD Club AND a member of USA Archery. Please bring proof of USA Archery Membership at check in time. NFAA membership is not applicable. If a registrant is a non US Citizen then they will compete in a Guest Class and USA Archery Membership is not required. Guest class participants are not eligible for National Grand Champion Awards.

Dress Code: USA Archery Dress Code applies to Official Practice, Competition Days and YOG Trials. International Teams may wear FITA code compliant uniforms. No Camouflage attire will be allowed at practice or tournament competition days.

Our goal is to run the tournament timing as close as possible to the above schedule, however, weather delays, protests, and/or other situations may arise beyond our control. The organizers reserve the right to modify the tournament format, if necessary. Announcements will be made at the field, during Team Meetings and posted at the venue and on the website.

The Olympic Rounds (OR) using the set system competition may extend up to sunset on Sunday June 27, 2010. If the tournament is stopped before completion, then the current archer standings at that time will be considered final.

Detailed Format:



Divisions:

Compound and Recurve

Age Classification, Male and Female:

Junior – Archers are eligible to shoot in the Junior Division through the calendar year of their 20th birthday (Born in or after 1990).

Cadet – Archers are eligible to shoot in the Cadet Division through the calendar year of their 17th birthday (Born in or after 1993).

Cub – Archers are eligible to shoot in the Cub Division through the calendar year of their 14th birthday (Born in or after 1996).

Bowmen - Archers are eligible to shoot in the Bowmen Division through the calendar year of their 12th birthday (Born in or after 1998).

Rounds:

Bowmen (Recurve and Compound) will be shooting at **30m** for all rounds; Qualification, Team Round, Open Mixed Team and the Olympic Round (OR) using the Set System.

Cubs (Recurve and Compound) will be shooting at **50m** for all rounds; Qualification, Team Round, Open Mixed Team and the Olympic Round (OR) using the Set System.

Cadets (Recurve and Compound) will be shooting at **60m** for all rounds; Qualification, Team Round, Open Mixed Team and the Olympic Round (OR) using the Set System.

Juniors (Recurve and Compound) will be shooting at **70m** for all rounds; Qualification, Team Round, Open Mixed Team and the Olympic Round (OR) using the Set System.

JOAD National Grand Champion:

The JOAD National Grand Champion will be crowned by taking the average of the archers' placements in the Qualification Round, Team Round* and the Olympic Round (OR) in all classes and divisions.

*All archers competing in the Team Round will receive a 1st place placement, regardless of where their team finishes.

The Mixed Team Round will not be factored into the final JOAD National Grand Champion results. The archer with the lowest average from all three rounds will be declared the overall JOAD National Grand Champion in their class and division. If the archers' average is tied, the final placement from the Olympic Round (OR) will be used as the tie-breaker.

Team Round:

For the Team Round, all archers will be placed on a team even if there are one or two 2-archer teams per division.

For Example:

If there are fewer than 6 archers in any division, there will not be a team round for that division and all archers in that division will receive an automatic "0" for the Team Round.

If an archer fails to compete in the team round they will receive 25 points.

All teams will be matched according to their placement in the qualification round. Team brackets will displayed on the field and will be ready for viewing on Saturday morning.

Open Mixed Team Round:

The Open Mixed Team Round is completely voluntary and no points will be awarded for participating in this event. A mixed team consists of a Male and a Female archer that shoots the same division (age group) and style of equipment. This event is being offered to bring more awareness to this format.

Youth Olympic Games (YOG) Selection Procedures:

To be eligible for the 2010 Youth Olympic Games, archers must be citizens of the United States and hold a valid U.S. Passport. Also, athletes that are born between Jan 1, 1992 and December 31, 1993 are eligible to compete in the YOG Trials. All archers must also achieve a minimum qualifying score. Only athletes that have achieved the minimum qualifying score by June 20, 2010 will be available to compete at the 2010 Youth Olympic Games Selection Shoot. 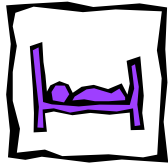
